**COURSE DESCRIPTION:**

A foundational study designed to give the student a grasp of the New Testament as a whole and a feel for each book in relation to the others. It will discuss the historical and cultural context of the world at the time of Jesus Christ and the disciples.

3. To be familiar with the main subjects and divisions of the NT.
