This course is an analytical study of the Old Testament books grouped as “Poetical Books.” The doctrinal and practical lessons are stressed and the student is taught to apply the truths learned to everyday life.

Course Required Reading

The Student will be required to read the Poetical Books according to the reading schedule provided by the instructor. Daily grades will be given for this reading. The Student will be required to purchase and read The Song Of Solomon by Dr. James Barker.

Course Objectives

1. Upon completion of the course, the student will have a thorough familiarization of the five books that comprise the Poetical Books.
2. Upon completion of the course, the student will be able to identify the historical, cultural, and doctrinal distinctives of each book.
3. Upon completion of the course, the student will have assembled usable notes and outlines to be used for further individual study and teaching.
